Located in the heart of the mid-Atlantic, Hampton Roads, Virginia is built around the world's largest natural deepwater harbor. The region's 50-foot channels and ice-free waterways make Hampton Roads as viable a choice for today's entrepreneurs and maritime corporations as it was 400 years ago for the earliest New World settlers. The region's three perpetually expanding cargo facilities — Norfolk International Terminals (NIT), Portsmouth Marine Terminal (PMT), and Newport News Marine Terminal (NNMT) are served by 20 steamship lines featuring weekly service to Europe and Asia. And once in port, two of the nation's largest railroads, Norfolk Southern and CSX, along with over 100 trucking lines, lay waiting to take your cargo to any line on the horizon. Recognizable maritime companies like Maersk Line Limited, CMA CGM, and Zim Integrated Shipping all have a substantial presence here, and the world's largest naval base and shipbuilding operation also call the region home. The U.S.A.'s first privately developed container terminal, APM Terminals, was completed here in 2007, and its ability to handle one million 20-foot equivalent units make it the most technologically advanced and environmentally sensitive container terminal in both of the Americas.
